A Few Dock Reminders

Hurricane season is here, so make sure your boat is in order - anchors, rode, dinks, dock boxes and everything else is ready.

Check your Hurricane Plan:

-  Correct phone numbers (yours and your buddy's)
-  Equipment is located and correctly documented on the plan
-  Engine runs, and importantly, dock lines can be untied

If we make the call to leave the docks, commit time for your boat, and to help with club supplies and equipment like BBQs, garbage cans, dock boxes and carts, bikes etc...



The marina is for all intents and purposes - full. Vacant slips have blank yellow boards on them. Rates for slips are posted under the clubhouse. We are generating a new waiting list, and one needs to be a member, and actually own the boat, to request a slip for it.

Finally, the end of A dock is not to be used, unless one is onboard the whole time the boat is there. B dock slips need the space for coming and going to their slips, and your boat may have to move at a moment's notice. C dock allows for 2 or 3 tie-ups. Contact the Dockmaster for overnight use.

ETYSA Offering Sailing Classes for Adults

ETYSA is excited to announce the addition of 2 new programs to its sailing-based curriculum: Adult Learn to Sail and Adult Learn to Race (aka Sailboat Racing 101).



The **Adult Learn to Sail** class is perfect for absolute beginners, those who have limited sailing experience or anyone who did some sailing a long time and wants to “shake off the rust”. This class is all about learning how to rig, launch, and navigate a small sailboat with confidence. The class meets every Wednesday and Thursday, from 5 to 8, beginning July 8th through July 23rd. The **Adult Learn to Race / Racing 101** class is geared for those who have some, or even a lot, of sailing experience but are new to sailboat racing. Students taking this class will learn how enter, prepare for, and manage being in a sailboat race or regatta. The Racing 101 class meets on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 5 to 8PM, beginning August 5th through August 20th. Private lessons are also available. The cost of a private lesson is \$50 per hour for the first student and \$35 per hour for each additional person.

All classes and private lessons will be taught at Blackbeard Sailing Club using ETYSA's fleet of O'Day Javelins. The Javelin is a 14ft dinghy with a main and jib.

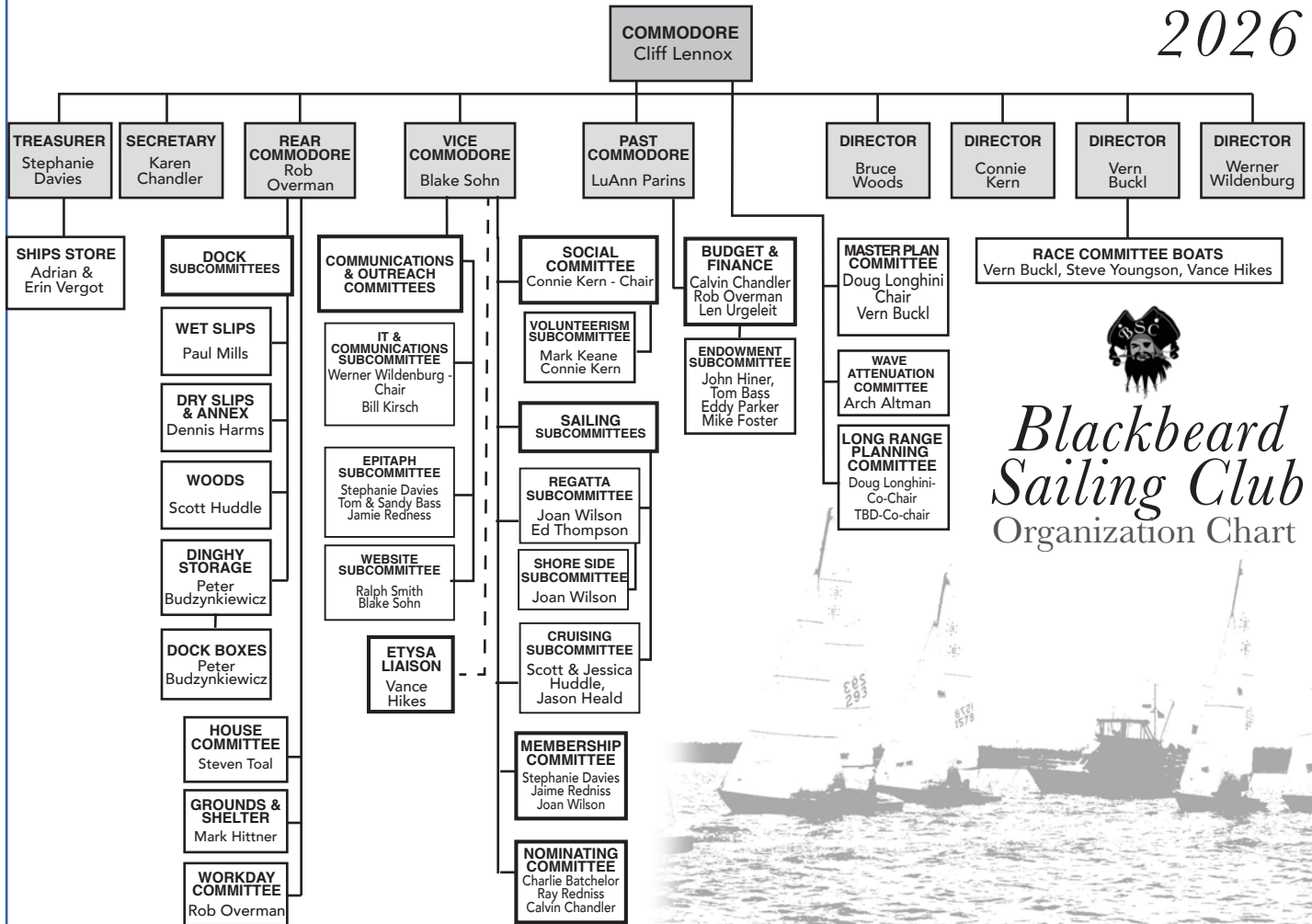
